

## Viewing the What-If Degree Audit Report

The What- If Degree Audit Report is a tool designed to allow students to see how course selection or change in major/minor affects requirements that a student needs to complete towards their undergraduate education at UMBC. You can create multiple “What-If” reports to see how different selections apply towards graduation and major requirements.

1. Log into **myUMBC**.
2. Locate the topic, **Advising and Student Support**.



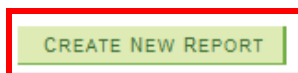
3. Click the link **What-If Degree Audit**.

### 45 Upper-Level credits

**24 Elective Credits**
